Math Activity



Sidewalk Chalk Math Relay: Draw a "Start" line with chalk and, about 10 yards away, a "Stop, Solve, and Sprint" line with a math problem. Your child runs to the line, solves the equation, and sprints back to tag you or take a break.

Water Balloon Math: Write numbers, shapes, or fractions on a target (or draw them on the driveway with chalk). Kids throw water balloons at the correct answers based on your equations

License Plate 24: While traveling or running errands, take the numbers on a passing license plate and use addition, subtraction, multiplication, or division to reach the target number of 24

Math Board Games: Classic games like **Yahtzee** are great for probability and rapid mental math, while games like *Proof!* are perfect for quick equation-building
