

On those days, students can simply place a magnet on their classroom whiteboard to let us know they'd like lunch. This process has allowed our lunch program working to prepare the right number of meals, and no student is ever turned away.

If our lunch program worker is away, we are prepared with frozen meals that can be warmed in the crock pot or oven, so food is always available.

We encourage students to enjoy the lunches brought from home first, as we truly value the time and money families put into preparing those meals.
